COMMENTS

CITY MANAGER: Mr. Fiscus thanked all the City employees for another good year; he thanked the finance office and department heads for their work on the 2025 budget, and he thanked Council for their support.

NEWS MEDIA: Melissa Klaric, Sharon Herald; Ms. Klaric asked if Council or Mr. Fiscus know of anything the City can do to help Sharon Regional. Mr. Fiscus said the City is doing everything we can to have discussions; we do not have the ability to attract other entities, but when those entities come forward, we can meet and discuss with them the hospital's importance to the city and the community's level of support. We want anyone who is interested in operating in Sharon to know that we embrace and welcome them. It is our goal to see the hospital remain open and provide good services.

MRS. BUNDRANT: Mrs. Bundrant echoed everything said. She said it was a good year; we did not raise taxes again.

CITIZENS: Kathy Testani, 417 Wilson Street; Ms. Testani said around 6:00 AM while traveling Meek Street, trucks are parked on Sharpsville Avenue, blocking the view to turn off of Meek Street. Mr. Fiscus recommended she report this when it happens.

Ben Griffin, 528 Dwyer Way; Mr. Griffin said Shenango Inn is up for Sheriff's Sale due to \$220,000 in back taxes. He asked if Mr. Landino will be taking over the property. Mr. Fiscus said he does not believe the sale has happened yet; if the Yanko Group pays the lienholder the money, they will retain ownership of it; otherwise, it should transfer to the lienholder, JCL Development. Mr. Fiscus said as the mortgage holder he had to push it to Sheriff's Sale; highest bidder will take ownership of the property.

Mr. Griffin asked if Sharon Regional is current on taxes due to the City of Sharon. Jason Tomko said they paid last year's taxes but have not yet paid current year real estate taxes, they have until December 30 to do so. They are still submitting quarterly earned income taxes through Berkheimer. Mr. Griffin asked what would happen if they did not pay the taxes and the amount owed. Mr. Tomko said the City real estate taxes total about \$170,000. Attorney Stedman clarified that the taxes are owed by the property owner, not the operator. The operator is in bankruptcy, the owner is not.

Dave McLaren, 1113 Haig Street; Mr. McLaren asked about updating and changing the Codified Ordinances and how citizens can learn what is being changed. Mr. Fiscus said legislation is passed publicly; then the changes are memorialized and made available online. Attorney Stedman said every Ordinance that is adopted is posted online. Mrs. Bundrant provided Mr. McLaren with a copy of draft Ordinance 16-24 which lists the changes included in this update.
